Ilan Buckman, <u>ilan@wheels.co</u>, Kim Pluth, <u>kpluth@wheels.co</u> Wheels is one of the LADOT approved operators, Has done 60-70 community engagement presentations. Use 311 to complain about scooter infractions. Wheels will be providing shared helmets. 15mph speed limit. Wheels is sharing data with city, doing geofencing. They would like to see more devices allowed to providers.

Santa Monica Blvd. convert existing bike lanes to protected bike lanes between Avenue of the Stars and Sepulveda Blvd. - Michael Schneider

MOTION: by Michael/Karen

The LABAC requests that CD5 and LADOT convert the existing bike lanes on SM Blvd. from Ave of the Stars to Sepulveda Bl. into protected (class IV) bike lanes by building a 3' buffer and adding bollards, restriping the street as needed, and painting the bike lanes green. This will give cyclists a continuous stretch of protected and/or green bike lane from Sepulveda Bl. to West Hollywood City Hall.

Passes unanimously

Public comment: extend the Santa Monica Blvd. bike lanes from Sepulveda to Barrington >> Add this to Project List, pursue with CD11

Foothill Blvd. bike lanes gap closure between LVT Recreation Center and Wheatland - John Laue MOTION, by John/ Mike Kaiser: BAC supports closure of the bike lane gap on Foothill Blvd. between LVT Rec Center and Wheatland, passes unanimously.

Venice Blvd. protected bike lanes between Lincoln Blvd. and Cadillac Ave. - Michael Schneider MOTION: By Michael/Jennifer

The LABAC strongly urges CD11 and CD5 to implement the City's own mobility plan and make room for protected bike lanes (class IV) on Venice Boulevard between Lincoln and Cadillac. Eventually, the LABAC would like to see the full 2035 Mobility Plan implemented, and protected (class IV) bike lanes implemented on Venice Boulevard from the ocean to Arlington and eventually to downtown Los Angeles. Passes unanimously
